that I needed to operate a successful Atlas office and had fairly firm plans in place on how that would be accomplished. I was prepared for the first time to serve God in a full time Christian role. "Humble" was probably not a good word for how I approached this opportunity but it definitely seemed like a decades-old calling to help others was finally being realizing.

We serve a God who is full of surprises. The first surprise in this fledgling ministry was the onslaught of Covid-19. Most of my plans did not change at that time, but they were definitely delayed for about a year. The silver lining for me was that it gave me a huge amount of time to develop the background organization for the ministry and to prepare the office for the eventual opening. That was a blessing for me because it gave me a safe place to be with tasks to do and helped me survive many of the negative aspects of Covid.

As the ministry opened and evolved, God continued to surprise me with things that altered my "plan," things that were remarkably better for our clients and the ministry itself. Somewhere in this process, I




was able to move from "in front" of Jesus as I attempted to <u>lead for</u> Him to "behind" Him where I was able to <u>simply follow</u> Him as He continued to provide surprise after surprise. 
## Thank You for Your Past Support and Ongoing Partnership with Us
