Atlas Banquet Guests “Experience” the Atlas Ministry

The First Annual “Atlas Experience” Banquet is now history and indeed is a positive addition to the history of Atlas of the Lakes Area. The initial goal for the banquet was to convey the true nature of Atlas (our most difficult task) to our supporters and the Lakes Area Community. The fact is that Christian ministries can relate their mission to supporters and/or community using the best communication techniques possible. But a genuine understanding of how God works through the ministry must be “experienced” by active participation. And this is only possible if you share an actual encounter with other people. Why do I share this nugget of wisdom? Because Tonya and I want everyone to “experience” God’s mighty hand in this tiny ministry in the same way that we are blessed as we share these special times nearly every day.

We approached the banquet program, “Invisibles,” differently than any other past Atlas banquets that I have taken part in. We did not cater to new participants who had a limited knowledge of Atlas. Instead, we targeted the whole audience as we revealed as much of the actual “experience” as we could create. Tonya did a marvelous job of making the experience of Atlas come to life for those attending. Her presentation was the best example of “sharing the actual Atlas experience” that we have been able to convey.

I have long known that a first-time ministry banquet will have about 60 people in attendance. Still, we set an optimistic goal at 150 and worked hard to fill the room. We invited many people whose lives, filled with family activities, encountered schedule conflicts. Attendance ended up at 65 with the room pleasantly filled. The same layout could have comfortably handled up to 110 but if we had accomplished our goal of 150, we would have been uncomfortably crowded. Why do I explain this in such detail? Because God’s plan is always better than our human efforts. We are delighted with the 65 people that God brought to us and believe they were hand-picked by Him to be there.

Here are some of the blessings that we sensed in our initial Atlas banquet:

- We had very generous pre-banquet financial gifts for table sponsorships and from donors who do not live in the Lakes Area.
- Through the RSVP process, 46 new families were added to our email list.
- Thirty-eight of the people attending the banquet were new to Atlas.
- Twenty-two new donors gave financial gifts that evening, and 6 others mailed donations since.
- Two people have offered monthly support (helps even our monthly income).
- We were able to reunite with past friends and also make many new ones.
- Tonya’s program, “Invisibles,” genuinely shared the “Atlas Experience” with our guests. (See her poem in this newsletter)

We are delighted with the way God used and continues to use our First Annual “Atlas Experience” Banquet to broaden the community's knowledge of the ministry in the Lakes Area.

As we prepared for the banquet a few weeks ago, my main task was to present a program so that those attending could “experience” how God works in the lives of Atlas clients as well as in the actual Atlas ministry. Dave and I bounced ideas off of each other as God prepared not only the program presentation but the agenda for the entire evening. It was an amazing process and I would like to share just one aspect of our preparation.

Do any of you have trust issues? I know I do, often showing up by trying to control outcomes and even success. How little do I truly “rely on” the power of our God? I limit Him to what I humanly grasp and even comprehend. Admitting this is downright embarrassing sometimes. If it weren’t for His endless mercies, I’d be lost in “my way” instead of trusting Him to guide me. I am targeting the word **“Trust”** specifically. When we choose to trust, it is only there where we can experience Him in ways we wouldn’t dream of. Every day, we should yield and place our trust in God but we don’t. Atlas is not our ministry, but His... and you know what, we are learning to trust more and more every day.

My prayer is that through the offer of this poem, you can all see how each day, with each client, and each situation requires a unique response from the Atlas staff. I also hope that you understand that the variety needed in our responses is provided by God daily.

Ministry Interrupts Mission

While we spent a substantial part of the couple last months on the many aspects of putting on a banquet, we received new client referrals, (22 in that time) and continued to maintain contact with those ongoing clients that were seeking life improvement. Presenting the first Atlas banquet, Tonya and I had substantial help from board members and key volunteers. However, much of the planning, preparation, and RSVP scheduling fell on our shoulders. The ongoing development of the Atlas Ministry, encouraging donations, and communicating the ministry to the Lakes Area community are all very important tasks of the Atlas. These tasks require the investment of significant staff hours.

The mission of providing direction and advocate support to those we meet who are facing some condition of life crisis, continues to be the driving force of what we feel "called" to do each day. We are committed to spending time with anyone who is referred to us and keeps their appointment. We never turn anyone away without having a "life story" session with them. Although we can't always find solutions to the immediate problem, we always provide some form of assistance. Some referrals are only looking for a financial handout, and have not reached the point of seeking bigger solutions, but those represent a very small percentage. The length and type of service that Atlas offers are totally dependent upon how ready and willing each client is to participate in knowing their needs.

We continue to need additional staff to handle the client's needs while we also attend to the needs of the ministry. As we look to 2024, we are poised, based on faith in Christ, to hire additional staff and have the time to do the special training that is necessary for all Atlas staff positions. As always, we trust God to provide in His way and in His time. Thank you for being a part of His plan.
